Activity Ideas that the rooms came up with:

<u>Splat</u>

Everyone stands in a circle, with the AL in the middle.



He/she holds out their hands, palms together, towards somebody to 'splat' them.

The student who has been splatted has to duck down, whilst the students on either side of the student who has ducked have to turn towards each other and splat each other by holding out their hands towards the other.

The slowest student out of the three is eliminated and has to sit down.

The aim of the game is to get all the students eliminated.

The final two students should stand back to back, and the AL tells them a chosen word, e.g. bananas.

The AL says different words beginning with B, and on each word the two students take a step forward.

When the AL says BANANAS the students turn around and splat each other. The winner is the fastest student.

4. Discipline



Be positive and assume that rules will be followed

a) Preventative Discipline - measures taken to pre-empt misbehaviour by keeping students engaged.

b) Supportive Discipline - measures taken to assist students with self-control by helping them get back on task.

c) Corrective Discipline - measures taken when students are not following school rules.
